## **Dear Our Lady of Grace family,**



# EXCERPTS

## THIS IS MY BODY ESTE ES MI CUERPO

*"Everything in the created order, even inanimate objects, even the most distant cosmic force, even realities that I cannot see-is brother and sister to me." (pg 3)*

*ESP: "Todo en el orden creado, incluso los objetos inanimados, incluso la fuerza cósmica más distante, incluso las realidades que no puedo ver, es hermano y hermana para mí." (pág. 3)*

Bishop Barron's book was designed to accompany the Eucharistic Revival which is in its third year. The following sections are excerpted from This Is My Body with questions and points for further meditation.

### Reflection questions:

I. "Why did God who is perfect in every way bother to create at all? God created the heavens and the earth "of his own goodness and almighty power, not for the increase of his own happiness." (...) Good, by its very nature, is diffusive of itself. When you are in a good mood, you don't hide yourself away; on the contrary, you tend to effervesce, communicating your joy." (pg. 1-2)

- Everything God created was very good. God was delighted with his work of creation, and when he looked at it, it gave him joy. When you look around and see God's creation – the mountains, the stars at night, beautiful flowers, animals, family members or friends etc. – do you feel joy? What are you grateful for? Everything God created is to share his happiness. Ask God to see his creation through his eyes and sense the joy he has for all he created including you.

II. "Love is not a feeling or a sentiment...in its essence, love is an act of the will, more precisely, the willing of the good of the other as other. To love is really to want what is good for someone else and then to act on that desire. (...) Real love is an ecstatic act, a leaping outside of the narrow confines of my needs and desires and embrace of the other's good for the other's sake.
