THE EXAMEN

July 31st is the official Feast Day of one of the most well recognized saints in the Catholic Church, St. Ignatius of Loyola. This great man had such a profound encounter with Jesus that turned his life around. One of St. Ignatius greatest and most useful teachings is **The Examen**- a review of our actions at the light of God. The Examen allows us to know ourselves, recognize our faults and temptations, realize God's daily blessings and gain insights to grow in virtue. Read the **5 steps** to do The Examen and become a better person with a better relationship with Jesus:

- 1. START WITH GRATITUDE:** Start with thanking God for the blessings He gives to you each day. Reflect on the big and small things alike.
- 2. CALL ON THE HOLY SPIRIT:** Ask for the Holy Spirit to be your guide during the next step of the Examen, which is identifying the failures and the temptations you allowed. The Holy Spirit will help you to avoid hiding in denial, wallowing in self-pity or seethe in self-loathing.*
- 3. REVIEW AND RECOGNIZE FAILURES:** Ask the Lord to show you where you failed and where you can improve. This is the heart of the Examen, as it demands a honest "soul-searching."
- 4. ASK FOR FORGIVENESS AND HEALING:** After recognizing your failures and sins, ask the Lord for forgiveness and healing. Spend some time in quiet reflection and let God show you His mercy.
- 5. PRAY ABOUT THE NEXT DAY:** Imagine how your day might go, by looking at your agenda for the next day. Ask the Lord to walk with you, especially during difficult tasks or moments that you anticipate facing.

DEAR OUR LADY OF GRACE FAMILY,***Praised be Jesus Christ...now and forever!***

The next few Sundays we are reflecting on the Gospel of John chapter six, referred to as the "Bread of Life" discourse. We have just concluded the National Eucharistic Congress; we have just begun the third phase in which the Church is called to go out on mission. The Holy Spirit that gathers us as the assembly is the same dynamic force who sends us out. We are admonished at every Mass "to go and scatter" not to stay here but to fill world with Eucharistic life! I would like to share with you this Sunday an Angelus reflection Pope Francis gave in 2015 on the continuation of John 6:

This Sunday the Reading of Chapter Six of the Gospel according to John continues. After the multiplication of the loaves, the people went in search of Jesus and finally found him near Capernaum. He was well aware of the motive for their great enthusiasm in seeking him and he made this clear to them: "you seek me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves" (Jn 6:26). In fact, those people followed him for the material bread which had placated their hunger the previous day, when Jesus had performed the multiplication of the loaves; they had not understood that that bread, broken for so many, for the multitude, was the expression of the love of Jesus himself. They had given more meaning to that bread than to its donor. Before this spiritual blindness, Jesus emphasizes the necessity of going beyond the gift, to discover, come to know the donor. God himself is both the gift and the giver. Thus from that bread, from that gesture, the people can find the One who gives it, who is God. He invites them to open up to a perspective which is not only that of the daily need to eat, dress, achieve success, build a career. Jesus speaks of another food. He speaks of a food which is incorruptible and which is good to seek and gather. He exhorts: "Do not labour for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of man will give to you" (v. 27). That is to say, seek salvation, the encounter with God.

With these words, he seeks to make us understand that, in addition to physical hunger man carries within him another hunger — all of us have this hunger — a more important hunger, which cannot be satisfied with ordinary food. It is a hunger for life, a hunger for eternity which He alone can satisfy, as he is "the bread of life" (v. 35). Jesus does not eliminate the concern and search for daily food. No, he does not remove the concern for all that can make life more progressive. But Jesus reminds

us that the true meaning of our earthly existence lies at the end, in eternity, it lies in the encounter with Him, who is gift and giver. He also reminds us that human history with its suffering and joy must be seen in a horizon of eternity, that is, in that horizon of the definitive encounter with Him. And this encounter illuminates all the days of our life. If we think of this encounter, of this great gift, the small gifts of life, even the suffering, the worries will be illuminated by the hope of this encounter. "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst" (v. 35). This refers to the Eucharist, the greatest gift that satisfies the soul and the body. Meeting and welcoming within us Jesus, "Bread of Life", gives meaning and hope to the often winding journey of life. This "Bread of Life" is given to us with a task, namely, that we in our turn satisfy the spiritual and material hunger of our brothers, proclaiming the Gospel the world over. With the witness of our brotherly and solidary attitude toward our neighbour, we render Christ and his love present amid mankind.

May the Blessed Virgin sustain us in the search and sequela of her Son Jesus, the true bread, the living bread which does not spoil, but which endures for eternal life. Please continue to pray for our efforts to live out the fruits of the Eucharistic Congress but also the call to change our world by being Eucharist for others. We pray in reparation for the mockery and blasphemes against Jesus in the Eucharist, the Catholic faith, and our Christian identity in areas like sports events, concerts, art expositions, etc. Eucharistic Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us and on the whole world!

Registration for Family Faith Formation and Confirmation is open. If your child or children or grandchildren or family member is in need of catechetical formation to prepare for the sacraments, all are welcome and we have a place for you.

Last week we had the opportunity as part of our summer projects plan to repave the entire parking lot. Some of the finding came through a grant via the archdiocese and the Called to Renew Campaign. I invite you to continue praying and fulfilling the pledges as we work on the projects. Check out the progress on the parking lot via our bulletin and social media. St. Joseph help us in our temporal needs!

**QUERIDA FAMILIA DE NUESTRA
SEÑORA DE LA GRACIA,
¡Alabado sea Jesucristo hoy y siempre!**

Los próximos domingos reflexionaremos sobre el capítulo seis del Evangelio de Juan, conocido como el discurso del “Pan de Vida”. Acabamos de concluir el Congreso Eucarístico Nacional; acabamos de comenzar la tercera fase en la que la Iglesia está llamada a salir en misión. El Espíritu Santo que nos reúne como asamblea es la misma fuerza dinámica que nos envía. ¡Somos amonestados en cada Misa a “ir y dispersarnos” no para quedarnos aquí sino para llenar el mundo de vida eucarística! Me gustaría compartir con ustedes este domingo una reflexión del Ángelus que el Papa Francisco dio en 2015 sobre la continuación de Juan 6:

Este domingo continúa la lectura del capítulo seis del Evangelio según Juan. Después de la multiplicación de los panes, la gente fue en busca de Jesús y finalmente lo encontró cerca de Cafarnaúm. Él era muy consciente del motivo de su gran entusiasmo al buscarlo y se lo dejó claro: “me buscáis, no porque habéis visto signos, sino porque habéis comido de los panes y os habéis saciado” (Jn 6,26). En efecto, aquella gente lo seguía por el pan material que había calmado su hambre el día anterior, cuando Jesús había realizado la multiplicación de los panes; no habían comprendido que aquel pan, partido para tantos, para la multitud, era la expresión del amor de Jesús mismo. Habían dado más sentido a aquel pan que a su donador. Frente a esta ceguera espiritual, Jesús subraya la necesidad de ir más allá del don, de descubrir, de conocer al donador. Dios mismo es don y donador. Así, desde aquel pan, desde aquel gesto, la gente puede encontrar a Aquel que lo da, que es Dios. Los invita a abrirse a una perspectiva que no es sólo la de la necesidad cotidiana de comer, de vestirse, de alcanzar el éxito, de construir una carrera. Jesús habla de otro alimento. Habla de un alimento incorruptible y que es bueno buscar y recoger. Exhorta: «Trabajad no por el alimento que perece, sino por el alimento que permanece para la vida eterna, el que os dará el Hijo del hombre» (v. 27). Es decir, buscar la salvación, el encuentro con Dios. Con estas palabras, Jesús quiere hacernos comprender que, además del hambre física, el hombre lleva en sí otra hambre —todos la tenemos—, un hambre más importante, que no se puede saciar con el alimento común. Es un hambre de vida, un hambre de eternidad que sólo Él puede saciar, porque Él es «el pan de vida» (v. 35). Jesús no elimina la preocupación y la búsqueda del alimento cotidiano. No, no elimina la preocupación por todo lo que puede hacer más progresiva la vida. Pero Jesús nos recuerda que el verdadero sentido de nuestra ex-


istencia terrena está al final, en la eternidad, está en el encuentro con Él, que es don y dador. Nos recuerda también que la historia humana con sus sufrimientos y sus alegrías debe ser vista en un horizonte de eternidad, es decir, en ese horizonte del encuentro definitivo con Él. Y este encuentro ilumina todos los días de nuestra vida. Si pensamos en este encuentro, en este gran don, en los pequeños dones de la vida, incluso en el sufrimiento, las preocupaciones se iluminarán con la esperanza de este encuentro. «Yo soy el pan de vida: el que viene a mí no tendrá hambre, y el que cree en mí no tendrá sed jamás» (v. 35). Se trata de la Eucaristía, el don más grande que sacia el alma y el cuerpo. Encontrar y acoger en nosotros a Jesús, «Pan de vida», da sentido y esperanza al camino a menudo tortuoso de la vida. Este «Pan de vida» se nos da con una tarea, es decir, que nosotros también saciemos el hambre espiritual **y** material de nuestros hermanos, anunciando el Evangelio en todo el mundo. Con el testimonio de nuestra actitud fraterna y solidaria hacia el prójimo, hacemos presente a Cristo y su amor en medio de los hombres.

Que la Santísima Virgen nos sostenga en la búsqueda y el seguimiento de su Hijo Jesús, el verdadero pan, el pan vivo que no se corrompe, sino que permanece para la vida eterna.

Por favor, sigan orando por nuestros esfuerzos para vivir los frutos del Congreso Eucarístico, pero también el llamado a cambiar nuestro mundo siendo Eucaristía para los demás. Oramos en reparación por las burlas y blasfemias contra Jesús en la Eucaristía, la fe católica y nuestra identidad cristiana en áreas como eventos deportivos, conciertos, exposiciones de arte, etc. ¡Corazón Eucarístico de Jesús, ten piedad de nosotros y del mundo entero!

La inscripción para la Formación de la Fe y Confirmación Familiar está abierta. Si su hijo, hijos, nietos o algún miembro de su familia necesita formación catequética para prepararse para los sacramentos, todos son bienvenidos y tenemos un lugar para usted. La semana pasada tuvimos la oportunidad, como parte de nuestro plan de proyectos de verano, de repavimentar todo el estacionamiento. Parte de lo recaudado se logró gracias a una subvención de la arquidiócesis y la Campaña Llamados a Renovar. Los invito a seguir orando y cumpliendo las promesas mientras trabajamos en los proyectos. 
